Hooded Plovers

It is possible that many Port Moorowie residents don't realise what you have on your door step, but McEachen Beach is considered a Hooded Plover haven with sometimes as many as 8 pairs trying to nest at the same time. At the last Hoodie survey, I spotted 7 pairs with 5 nests (some are on their 3rd attempt already), and a pair with two 6 week old chicks. In the Mozzie Flat area I recorded 5 pairs with 4 nests, so the season has truly started, and could last until March if their nests and chicks fail to reach the age of 7 weeks, which is the time when they can fly and get away from predators – fox and cat prints can be seen all along the beaches.



We tagged 5 birds last year with flags, which are white with black letters, being affixed on the right upper leg. Birds flagged were MW at the boat ramp, KA and MC on McEachen Beach which I have spotted consistently returning there. Another bird, DA, was only seen returning once last year, and also last year the fledgling, DY, was last seen west of the Mozzie Flat end of the beach, but it's not surprising for a fledgling to find their own territory far away from their parents. I welcome information about any sightings, and especially if you happen to spot any tagged birds or chicks!



Please remember to keep your dog on a leash if you see any Hooded Plovers and take notice of signed areas. Do not stay on the beach too close to them as the parents will not sit on their eggs, and the eggs will fail if left alone for long periods in hot or cold weather.

Echidnas, sometimes known as spiny anteaters, are quill-covered monotremes (egg-laying mammals). The four still-existing species of echidnas and the platypus are the only living mammals that lay eggs and the only surviving members of the order Monotremata.



Blue Tongue Lizards have somewhat **unusual body proportions**: a big head and long body with very short legs and small feet. Their evenly tapering tail is fat and shorter than the body.

Male lizards have a proportionally larger head than females, but the females are bigger overall. The most noticeable feature of these lizards is **the blue tongue inside the bright pink mouth**. They are not very fast so:


